JOURNALISTS ONLINE TRAINING MODULE

The need for journalists training on climate change, environment and disaster reporting is very huge and therefore cannot be satisfied in the current face-to-face activities. However, it is extremely costly to hold face-to-face training for all journalists who need it. Also, the extent of material that can be covered in the two days training is limited. To complement this, online training presents an opportunity to extend trainings to more journalists and provide content more depth.

Why Online Training

Online training offers a number of advantages, making it effective methods of delivery of material to journalists.

- 1. Low training costs- Producing learning content is time consuming, online or otherwise.
- 2. Effective Delivery-- Because E- learning is not limited by geography or time, it is possible to avail the course not only to large amount of time but also allow journalists who have tight and at time tricky schedules to learn.
- 3. Standardization. E-Learning allows for creation of standardized process and consistency in the delivery of content.
- 4. It also compresses delivery time.
- 5. Access- E-Learning allows learners to access materials from any location at any time as long as they have internet.
